FROM OUR PASTOR

Advent! It means a *beginning*. The start or arrival of some person, thing, or event of note. For us, Advent starts the Christian calendar year. Advent begins the new Christian year as a period of preparation for Christmas.

Theologically, Advent is the coming of Christ. Of Emmanuel, God with us.

When you receive this newsletter, we will be fully into the season of Advent, when we prepare our hearts to once again welcome Jesus into our lives.

This year, however, it will all be different than any of us have ever experienced. With some of the highest levels of COVID-19 since the pandemic began, we can't do things the same way we've done them in the past.

Rather than regretting what we won't be able to do this year because of the pandemic, let me ask you one very important question this year:

people to worship at (but not IN) the church, weather permitting. Please be sure to watch for details to come in the first two weeks of December.

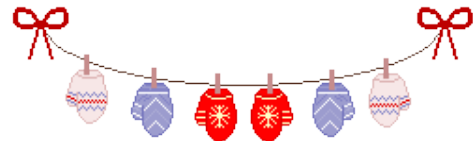


OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOE BOX "THANK YOU"
