Ruth Roberts became my second mother and cared and nurtured me until her death in 2003. I want to share with you an anonymous tribute to mothers. I wish I could take credit for it, but I just want to express my deep appreciation to God for providing me with two wonderful mothers.

"If I live in a house of spotless beauty with everything in its place, but have not love, I am a housekeeper ... not a homemaker. If I have time for waxing, polishing, and decorative achievements, but have not love, my children learn cleanliness ... not godliness. Love leaves the dust in search of a child's laugh. Love smiles at tiny fingerprints on a newly cleaned window. Love wipes away the tears before it wipes up the spilled milk. *Love* picks up the child before it picks up the toys. Love is present through trials. Love reprimands, reproves, and is responsive. Love crawls with the baby, walks with the toddler, runs with the child, then stands aside to let the youth walk

into adulthood. *Love* is the key that opens salvation's message to a child's heart. Before I became a mother I took glory in my house of perfection. Now I glory in God's perfection of my child.

As a mother, there is much I must teach my child ... but the greatest of these is *LOVE!*"

For obvious reasons, I will never experience motherhood. But, I thank God every day for the blessings of the mothers God used to nurture and guide me in my faith. And I echo the words of the Psalmist when he wrote, "Give her (a mother) the reward she has earned, and let her works bring her praise ..." (Psalm 31:31)

#### **FOOD PANTRY**

School will soon be ending, and many children will be eating lunch at home during the summer. This presents a hardship for many families. To offer some relief, let us be challenged during the month of May to collect as many lunch items as we can, filling both the bin and the shopping cart. The collection item for May is boxed cereal. While cereal is an acceptable lunch item, any other lunch product is also a great help. Let's also step-up to the challenge of donating \$100 to the food pantry for perishable items. It takes a lot of milk for all of that cereal! Other suggestions: Canned pasta, nonperishable microwave meals, ramen noodles, peanut butter and jelly, and soup.

#### **OPERATION SHOE BOXES**




